STUDENTS SHOULD BRING:

- Notebook and pen
- 4x 6 blank white index cards (about two dozen)
- Scotch tape
- Scissors
- Don't forget to bring a camera!
- A couple of interesting photos, calendar shots or other inspirational images. These may be digital.
- Thrums. Lots of them, in all shades and textures. Have available small "couple of yard" amounts of whatever is accessible, leftover warp ends, thrums, cuts from existing cones or balls of yarn. Always keep a bag handy for play. Thrums and ends can be wound onto narrow drinking straws for tidy storage. For guilds meeting together in person, consider having everyone pool their thrums so all participants may share.
