


TRIANGULAR BOUND BUTTONHOLES

DETERMINE "BUTTONHOLE LENGTH":

BUTTON DIAMETER + BUTTON THICKNESS + $\frac{1}{8}$ " TO $\frac{1}{4}$ " FOR EASE =
BUTTONHOLE LENGTH




DETERMINE BASE WIDTH


DRAW BUTTONHOLE ON PAPER



CUT OPEN AND
TEST FIT
BUTTON



FUSE INTERFACING TO WRONG SIDE OF
GARMENT



MACHINE BASTE CENTER PLACEMENT
LINE AND END LINES

ADD TWO ROWS OF STITCHING
PARALLEL TO PLACEMENT LINE TO
INDICATE WIDTH OF BASE



USE CHALK, PENCIL, OR MARKER TO
DRAW TRIANGLE FOR BUTTONHOLE



CHOOSE BUTTONHOLE FABRIC “PATCH”

ULTRASUEDE “FACILE” OR “LIGHT” WORKS WELL WITH HANDWOVENS

FOR EACH BUTTONHOLE, CUT A “PATCH” ON THE STRAIGHT GRAIN 2 “ LONGER THAN BUTTONHOLE LENGTH AND 4 TIMES THE BASE WIDTH





MARK “PATCH” CENTER AND ENDS WITH CHALK

WITH RIGHT SIDES TOGETHER CENTER A “PATCH” OVER MACHINE BASTED MARKINGS ON GARMENT MATCHING CENTERS AND ENDS




MACHINE BASTE ALONG CENTER PLACEMENT LINE BEGINNING AND ENDING WELL BEYOND END LINES



FROM THE WRONG SIDE OF GARMENT (INTERFACING SIDE UP) STITCH EXACTLY IN THE MARKED TRIANGLE USING SMALL STITCHES (20/INCH)

BEGIN AND END ON A LONG EDGE, PIVOTING WITH A TINY DIAGONAL STITCH ACROSS ENDS

REMOVE CENTER LINE BASTING



SLASH BUTTONHOLE "PATCH" FROM OUTER EDGE TO EACH POINT OF STITCHED TRIANGLE

THEN SLASH GARMENT AND "PATCH" ALONG CENTER LINE STOPPING 1/4" FROM BASE





CLIP TO EACH CORNER OF BASE

TURN BASE OF PATCH TO WRONG SIDE AND PRESS




PRESS EACH REMAINING SECTION OF "PATCH" TOWARD SLIT



NOW TURN REMAINING SECTIONS OF "PATCH" TO WRONG SIDE OF GARMENT, WRAPPING AROUND TRIANGULAR SEAM ALLOWANCES CREATED BY SLASH



THIS CREATES THE BUTTONHOLE "LIPS"



**PRESS FROM THE RIGHT SIDE
MAKING SURE LIPS ARE EVEN**

**FROM RIGHT SIDE STITCH IN
DITCH BEGINNING AT BASE
CORNER AND ENDING AT POINT
ON EACH SIDE**




**TO SECURE BASE, FOLD GARMENT
BACK ON ITSELF AND STITCH
THROUGH ALL LAYERS OF BASE JUST
INSIDE PREVIOUS STITCHING**



TRIM AWAY EXCESS PATCH

REMOVE ALL BASTING THREAD



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
